Here are some changes to our CSMLA members postal match. The format will change in a way that will make the match more accessible to all our members. Here are the entire rules for the postal match including changes. Please read through and note the changes in **bold**.

What is the entry fee? There is no entry fee. There is no cost to participate.

Who can enter? The CSMLA postal is for CSMLA members only. Memberships include all family members including children under age 18 and junior members.

How do I get targets? You can download targets at https://www.csmla.net/csmla-postal-match

What if I don't have access to the internet how can I get targets? In a pinch, you can contact Ron Mann at 303-257-7239. He will send you a single target which you can copy or have copied.

Targets do not have to be mailed in. Text or email a photo of your target (get close!) to Ron Mann at 303-257-7239

Targets and photos of targets must be whole. No missing corners or torn off portions.

The match is scored monthly and winners determined annually. At the end of the year the shooter with the highest single target score for the year will win 2 pounds of powder. The shooter with the second highest single target score for the year will win 1 pound of powder. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the annual Convention and Trade Show in March. Wildlife Report by David H. McCord, Wildlife Director

The following comments are from the recent meetings of the Colorado Wildlife Conservation Project (CWCP) wildlife legislation, wildlife issues, and firearms legislation. The CWCP has accomplished and maintains a high level of credibility and respect at the Capital. CSMLA membership is paying off. I get calls and messages on issues. description for this session of the legislature is a "year of defense" for the sports person community. The Senate proved to be the voice of reason, esp. in turning back the Assault Weapons Ban. The gun and ammo excise tax bill will go to the voters in November. Our focus now needs to be on opposing initiative #91 that would ban mountain lion and bobcat hunting and trapping and the two Denver initiatives, to ban fur sales and to outlaw slaughterhouses. These are all horrid ideas and advanced by radical and purposeful animal rights interests. The Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus will need new leaders as the incumbents will not return, Sen. Will is running for county commissioner and Rep. McLachlan is term limited.

The CWCP is preparing a position statement on initiative #91. The proponents are spreading emotional assertions to support #91, who would kill baby mountain lions, kill mom lions (not legal anyway), etc.

The CWCP expresses appreciation to the legislators who stuck their necks out to support us, in particular Sen. Dylan Roberts - maybe help him with his campaign fund raiser. Legislators are already being solicited for bills for next session though thinking is there will be fewer anti-gun efforts. The ag community will push for expanded opportunity to take out predator wolves given the weak response by Gov. Polis and the wolf predation on North Park The CPW staff has done livestock. admirable work on wolf issues however.

We put up a fight to oppose a candidate for the CPW Commission and he withdrew, a win for us as he did not reflect our commitment to wildlife and sportsmen. Several other CPW Commission vacancies are up this year.

Below is a summation of wildlife bills and gun bills with status to May 11. Where word "passed" appears, these go on to Gov. Polis to sign or deny meaning there is room to express your opinion to him (and his staff). Comments also sourced from the from the NRA-ILA Colo. Gun Collector web pages.

- HB24-1292 -"Assault the Weapons Ban" - DEAD. Per one of the sponsors, Dem. Sen. Julie Gonzales, Denver. "--- that more conversations need to take place outside of the pressure cooker of the Capitol during the last weeks of the legislative session." Unknown to me is what role Gov. Polis had in this bill's introduction and its later withdrawal. He may oppose this bill.
- HB24-1310 the SLOWER Bill concealed carry).
- HB24-1270 the Liability Insurance Requirement" DEAD, died on calendar
- HB24-1174 Concealed Carry Training Requirement Increase - Passed. Adds training requirements for applicants and class instructors to be certified by the CBI. This legislation is a solution in search of a problem meant to harass gun owners and instructors by arbitrarily raising the qualification standards and likely the costs, despite not showing any existing deficiency in the current training standards.
- SB24-131 Prohibiting Carrying Firearms in Sensitive Spaces. application is much smaller than initial draft. Passed.
- SB24-003 CBI "Gun Police" Task Force - Passed.
- SB24-066 Bill to track firearm purchases to build a gun-owner registry -Passed.
- "Firearms HB24-1349 -Ammunition Excise Tax" - Passed, will be on the November ballot, is a tax, vote no!

- HB24-1353 "Firearms Dealer Requirements & Permit" (state permit for gun stores) - Passed. Creates a duplicative state level permitting system for federal firearm licensed dealers; imposes an unnecessary burden on these already highly regulated businesses.
- HB24-1348 "Secure Firearm Storage in a Vehicle" - Passed. Fabric case is OK but needs secured to vehicle; will be hard to enforce. Can't use glove box or center consul. The initial draft had a higher penalty to an owner of a stolen firearm than on the thief.
- SB24-036 CPW Commission members to host individual meetings with the public, meet and greets, may be via digital too.
- B24-171 Restore wolverines. DEAD (re. school safety guards and Passed. A 10j provision provides this will be "experimental," with state participation; no restrictions on big game "Firearm hunting or livestock grazing.

Colorado State Shoot June UPDATE:

Hello, Muzzleloaders! Can you believe we are less than three months away from the 2024 Colorado State Shoot? The exact dates are Thursday, August 15th, through Sunday, August 18th. As you can see, the shoot will be 3 ½ days this year vs. 2 ½ days as in the past. We believe the extra day will allow more time to fire off another aggregate or two, possibly attract shooters from longer distances looking to tent or trailer camp, and give more time for just some good 'ol fun and socialization. We hope to see you there. Shooting starts on Thursday at about 1 pm after the range setup has been completed.

The 4H shooters have a bit of a conflict this year. They have a major event on the same weekend. To accommodate these shooters, we will hold the range open until 7 p.m. on Thursday and Friday.

The shoot will be held at the FLMLC range on the north edge of Ft. Lupton. Go west two blocks from CO Hwy. 85 on County Road 14 1/2 to Historic Parkway, and make a right (north) to the range.

Just a plug to please become a member of the State Association if you are currently not one. CSMLA serves to keep the sport of muzzle loading alive through various activities. These include:

- Working with the CO Division of Wildlife regarding policy changes and hunting regulations
- Partnering with the South Platte Valley Historical Society with various activities.
- The Colorado State Shoot in August
- The Colorado Invitational Shoot in October
- Educational event related to muzzleloading
- Working with junior and subjunior shooters to encourage them into our sport
- Hosting the Winter Convention
- Promoting Muzzleloading general which helps to keep our sport alive.

These are all very important activities, and it takes members to complete all of them. So, to encourage muzzle loaders to sign up, the usual annual dues of \$30 will be reduced to \$20 for any NEW member wanting to sign up at the State Shoot. This is your opportunity to be a part of something special at a reduced price.

Something new for 2024 is the return of the bench aggregate. You asked for it, and there you go!

Many of you will remember that one of the shooters at State last year brought up the fact that 4H and the Olympics use a broken line to trigger the next higher score vs a half-ball-in. So, since a broken line is easier to identify than a half-ball-in, why don't we go in that direction? Frankly, it made sense, and we looked into doing just that. We contacted the National Muzzleloading Association to see why they continued using the half-ball-in method. The answer is that muzzle loaders use a variety of calibers for any aggregate. A. 54 caliber has a much higher chance of cutting a line than a .40 caliber. This gives the larger caliber rifle or pistol an advantage. However, a half-ball-in is the same for any caliber. It just makes sense. So, we will continue to use the half-ballin method.

I think that about covers the three-month update. The Shooting Committee looks forward to seeing you all at the State Shoot in August!

Homeowner Defends Against Intruders With A Muzzle Loader

GEORGIA, VT - In a late-night defensive action, a homeowner used a muzzleloader rifle to critically wound an intruder during an attempted break-in.

The incident took place just after 11:30 p.m., when the homeowner encountered three armed individuals attempting to force entry into his residence through a locked door. Reacting to the imminent threat, the homeowner opened the door and fired his muzzle loader rifle at one of the

attempted break-in.

The wounded suspect was found in a neighboring yard and subsequently transported to a medical center, where he was listed in critical condition. The other two suspects fled the scene before law enforcement arrived. Vermont State Police have been actively investigating the case. executing a search warrant at the residence, conducting interviews, and following various leads. homeowner has been cooperating with the investigation. As of now, no arrests have been made in connection with the incident.



The Pasty

An epicurean institution while I was growing up in the UP was the pasty. It's roots go back to the 19th century copper and iron mining days when the miners would set out for a day of work with a pasty in a bucket or lunch bag. They would sometimes warm them on a shovel over a lantern for a delicious warm meal. Pastys remain popular to this day. A drive through Michigan, northern Wisconsin or Minnesota will quickly have you introduced by virtue of many roadside stands selling pastys to the passing tourists. My grandfather and his brother who went to work in the mines as teenagers viewed the pasty as both a treat and a staple. When I

> So, if you are off for a day at the range or on the hunt a pasty is a perfect companion. They are not difficult to make and there are many recipes out there. They all have the same basic ingredients. The recipe below is an excellent one and is from the book Michigan Cooking...and other things by Carole Eberly, eberly press, 430 Harrison, E. Lansing MI 48823.

> Let's start off with a list of the ingredients.

4 cups flour 2 tsp salt ½ tsp baking powder 1 ½ cups beef suet ground twice 10 Tbsp ice water 1 # sirloin diced ½ # lea pork diced 5 potatoes peeled and chopped 3 turnips scraped and diced 1 large onion 1 Tbsp salt 1 tsp pepper butter

Ok, onward to the actual making:

In a large bowl, combine flour, salt, baking powder and suet. Mix well using fingers until the mixture resembles coarse meal. Pour in ice water and gather into a ball. Add more water if needed. Divide the dough into six balls, dust each with flour and wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for one Combine the remaining ingredients except the butter. Roll each ball of dough in a circle on a floured surface to 1/4 inch thickness. Place 1 1/2 cups of filling on half of each circle of dough. Dot with butter, fold over unfilled half of dough and crimp the edges sealing by moistening lightly. The pastys will look like half moons. Bake on baking sheets at 400 for 45 minutes.


They can be enjoyed out of the oven or warmed later.
